Guiding Principles

Education is a basic human right.

Every person deserves an education, regardless of age, gender, nationality or refugee status, religion, ethnicity, or economic background.

Roshan is a place for people to grow academically and socially. Children, youth, and adults, especially those who have experienced trauma, develop and learn best in environments that are predictable and physically and emotionally safe.
